14: 1-12 "I am the way, and the truth, and the life"

4) The dominant theme of Psalm 37 is related to the contrast between the wicked and the righteous. Describe this contrast and then answer the question: Who will "inherit the land"?

5) Jesus' disciples were very upset that He was leaving. He promised to fill them with a "Helper" which was the Holy Spirit. On His last night with them, they were taught about it. What can you learn about the Holy Spirit from these verses? 14:16-17 15:26-27 16:7-15

6) Jesus' prayer for His disciples and for us is in chapter 17. Can you summarize it? How do you feel knowing that Jesus prayed and is praying these words for you?

7) Jesus' death and resurrection provide our only way back to God. As you read chapters 18-21 imagine the horror of Jesus' death on the cross, the excitement of His resurrection from the dead, and the hope we have because of His gift of eternal life.
